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Artist Statements

We live in a culture that is dominated by visual information. The media, in the form of images, video, and tag lines, have become our main source of information about ourselves and the world we live in. My work is a direct response to this. The media creates new images, information and identities without a responsibility to the public, nor facing consequence from the public. This negation of responsibility creates dangerous ideas of identity, worth and social standards. The work I make is a counterbalance to this. I take the things that are prevalent in our societies' media and find honesty and truth in them. My work is not created through market research; it is created through moral obligation, self criticism and direct interaction with the media. I select, recreate, and re-contextualize images and ideas that have been accepted by our culture which I feel need a second look. The fine arts are the only sector in society which have the ability to compete with the media in our visual landscape.

Jacqueline Swanek

My work references a split-level existence in which a dichotomy of experiences creates a lack of specificity or clear definition, challenging finality and the idea of absolute truth. The use of multidisciplinary approaches—including painting, printmaking, sculpture and mixed media work, are directly inspired by the examination of a multidimensional view. Relying on intuition and my immediate surroundings, I examine certain factors that form and break down perception such as the archetype, entropy and physics. I incorporate dualistic themes such as dormancy/exposure, accuracy/uncertainty, objectivity/subjectivity and the mind/body to explore precarious notions of awareness. The use of both legible and non-legible signifiers creates a surface tension that compromises assumption, blurs definitions, and emphasizes an "inbetweenness" or "hitch" in perception. One recurring use of signifiers is the reference to vehicle brake lights

and traffic stoplights. It is used to symbolize this perceptual alternation, which acts as a bridge between (a) linear and language-based thought, concern for details and categorization, individuality and subjective orientation; and (b) abstract, image-based thought, imagination, energy, raw emotion, concern for archetypal impulses and emphasis on the "big picture."
